Health Care Modernization and Our Community

Brian Mahoney pointed out that although Public Health and Health Care are related, they are not the same. The presentation title on the agenda was “Health Care Modernization”, whereas, the PowerPoint is actually titled “Public Health Modernization”.

The PowerPoint was then presented, and a copy is attached to these minutes. The presentation began with some definitions, history, where we are now, and what we are hoping to achieve (Advancing Health Equity). There was a lot of data presented regarding Health Determinant Factors, Health Equity/Disparities, as well as local population data.

SUMMARY SLIDE

- Public Health modernization is building the next phase of health;
 - It is similar to integration of clinical services (physical, behavioral, and dental);
 - It is integrating community support, social science, medicine, and public health practice to achieve optimal levels of health for all citizens, no matter where they live, learn, work, or play;
 - Health in All Policies is a powerful tool.

Shawn Lybarger began a discussion around the PowerPoint “Enhancing Services to Infants & Toddlers” that was presented at the governance meeting earlier this week. A handout of the PowerPoint was given to attendees. It was brought up that a workgroup might be started. At Umpqua Health – The Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) has funds for community projects and they are accepting applications through December 15th, 2018. Applications available on Umpqua Health’s website. Funding is available for community benefit programs and projects, such as those dealing with Access, Addiction, Mental Health, Parents and Children, Healthy Lifestyles, and others.

Healthy Families – Flu clinics are upcoming on November 3rd, 2018 in Drain and November 4th, 2018 in Myrtle Creek.

Head Start – The Health Services Advisory Committee meets once or twice a year and is currently sending invites. Head Start is applying for grant for a garden in our new building and working with Blue Zones to become a Blue Zones Certified Workplace.

South Central Early Learning Hub/DHS partnership – Working on a collaboration with DHS in Glendale with Hub and DHS representation in Glendale every month. The partnership is trying to change any negative notion of DHS. They are working on the thought that the HUB and DHS are there to help. It goes along with Authentic Parent/Community Engagement.
