

Douglas, Klamath and Lake Counties – Preschool Promise Q & A

1. Who handles Preschool Promise enrollment for Douglas, Klamath, and Lake Counties?

The South-Central Early Learning Hub handles Preschool Promise qualifications for these counties. You can learn more about the South-Central Early Learning Hub at www.SCELH.com.

3. When can I apply for Preschool Promise?

You can apply for the *current school* year at any time on the [enrollment portal](#) located at www.SCELH.com.

4. If eligible, is my child guaranteed a spot?

Applying does not automatically enroll your child or secure a seat. You will be notified of the eligibility process through email.

5. What will I need to apply for this program?

There is a three-step application process. When completing the application, you will need to provide proof of residence, income and the child’s birthdate before your application is reviewed for eligibility. Here is an [explanation of the documents](#) (located at www.SCELH.com under the *Preschool Promise* pages) that will need to be submitted.

6. My child was enrolled in a Preschool Promise classroom last year, do I need to reapply?

Yes. All interested students need to submit a new application. If your child is a current Preschool Promise student, the only additional document you need to submit with your application is a proof of residence.

7. I applied last year and my child did not get in. Do I need to reapply?

Yes. All previous applicants (including those who are not currently attending) to the Preschool Promise program need to reapply at our enrollment portal located at www.SCELH.com under the *Preschool Promise* pages.

8. My child attended PSP classroom last year and would like them to attend a different location this year, what do I need to do?

Apply as a returning student and indicate the new school you are requesting.

9. How do I apply for the Preschool Promise (PSP) program?

The South-Central Early Learning Hub is responsible for coordinating enrollment for the Preschool Promise classrooms in Douglas, Klamath and Lake Counties with a few exceptions. 10. Can I get a paper PSP application?

The online application is the best and quickest way to apply. The instructions on how to navigate the application are at www.SCELH.com under the *Preschool Promise* pages. However, if you prefer, you can print a paper application.

11. Can I get help completing the PSP application?

12. What do I need to provide when I apply?

You will need to provide proof of residence, income, and your child’s birthdate. Please refer to the [instruction sheet](#),

13. Are there any PSP sites in Douglas, Klamath, and Lake Counties that you don't handle enrollment for? And how would I apply with those?

14. Do I meet the resident requirements for PSP?

You must live in Oregon for your child to be eligible for Preschool Promise. Some school districts require you to live within their school catchment area.

15. Will my child be the correct age to attend?

The child needs to be 3 or 4-years-old on or by September 1st of the beginning of the school year.

16. My child will turn 3-years-old a few days after September 1st, can I get an exception?

The birthdate requirement is an Oregon law (ORS 329.172), and we cannot make age exceptions for Preschool Promise.

17. Are children in foster care eligible for Preschool Promise?

Yes, as long as the child meets age and residence requirements. Children living in foster care are income-eligible and do not need to provide proof of income.

18. Is there an income requirement?

Preschool Promise (PSP) program is intended to assist families that are living at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level in Oregon.

19. How do I determine if my household income qualifies?

If your household's gross income is at or below the 200% FPL for your family size in the chart below, you meet the income requirement for Preschool Promise. If you have additional household members living in your home, please contact the Early Learning Hub to determine income qualification.
